SPOTLIGHTED STAR VOLUNTEER - QUARTER ENDING 3/31/2024 SISTER MARTHA BURBULLA

Our selected star volunteer for the quarter ending March 31, 2024 is Sister Martha. She, like all our other volunteers, has all the qualities that makes her an outstanding volunteer. I asked Sister Martha to help me with this writeup especially outlining her volunteer efforts to ensure that I don't miss any of these activities. Sister, like all the other volunteers I have dealt with, state that their volunteer efforts are minimum and are not worthy of such recognition. In fact, Sister Martha, will tell you all she does is unlock and lock up the church as needed She seemed to have forgotten that she also serves as a lector and hospitality greeter. In addition, she assists with preparing labels for pie boxes and other Church-related odds and ends. She has assisted with religious education in the Parish as Program Coordinator and teacher. Currently she offers seasonal adult programs and is helping with Sacramental preparation assistance.

Sister Martha Burbulla Her primary ministry role is in the Parish house that the Diocesan Fulton County Catholic Mission occupies. In 1998, Sister Martha joined Sister Margie Monahan in that ministry of presence and service within this County with few Catholics. Since Sister Margie's death, Sister Martha has been running these endeavors. One of these undertakings provides assistance to those individuals struggling with rent, utilities, fuel, food and clothing. Another is the Treasures for Children Program which involves the collection, wrapping, and distribution of Christmas presents to children whose families

are struggingly financially. Also provided to these children is the collection and distribution of backpacks and other school supplies to approximately 400-500 children. St Stephen Parish gets credit for much of what happens from the Mission because most of the distribution takes place from the Parish Hall and the Office location.

Following are probably little known facts about the busy and industrious Sister. She taught French at Bishop Carroll High School in Ebensburg, PA and also has served as a translator in over 30 trips to Haiti visiting the Haitian Community of Little Sisters of the Incarnation with whom her Community has been in a relationship of friendship and help for many years. She, also, spent many years in various parishes of the Diocese in Blair, Cambria and Somerset Counties organizing and teaching catechists as Director of Religious Education and for Diocesan Programs.

Sister Martha was born in the Richland Township section of Johnstown living with her parents and younger sister and brother. She entered the Convent in 1960 in Ebensburg, joining the Sisters of St. Ann. In 1971 she was part of the group founding the Carmelite Community of the Word. That is another story.
